



USING THIS GUIDE

This guide has been published to assist students in preparing for transfer to Webster University from St. Charles Community College in the areas of Creative Writing, English, and English with an Emphasis in Drama & Playwriting. A minimum of 120 credit hours consisting of the following:

- x Applicable University Global Citizenship Program hours
- x 36 credit hours for the Major
- x International language requirement
- x Electives

INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT:

In addition to the required courses in the major, students are required to have three credit hours in a foreign language (expertise demonstrated by coursework or testing). Courses used towards the International Language Requirement must be completed at Webster University.



WEBSTER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

When considering an application, Webster looks for evidence of potential for academic success. A cumulative GPA on all college level coursework of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale is preferred; however, each applicant is given individual consideration.
